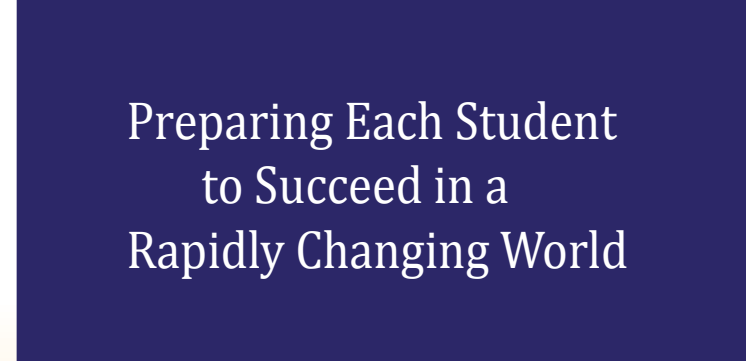

About Visions In Education

Visions In Education (Visions) is a fully WASC accredited San Juan Unified School District charter school that provides **TUITION FREE** educational programs for two student populations: HOME SCHOOL and INDEPENDENT STUDY.

Visions serves kindergarten through 12th grade (K-12) students in Sacramento County and eight surrounding counties (Amador, Contra Costa, El Dorado, Placer, San Joaquin, Solano, Sutter, and Yolo).

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K-12 HOME SCHOOL ACADEMY

The Visions In Education K-12 Home School Academy is open to K-12 students whose families are committed to providing a minimum of four to six hours per day of instruction within the home.

Credentialed teachers work with families to ensure curriculum meets California State Content Standards and to assess student achievement.

Families participating in the K-12 Home School Academy access student instructional budgets to utilize a variety of curriculum, services (tutoring, lessons, field trips, etc.), computers, Internet access, and HP printers. In addition, Visions provides a variety of classes, seminars, and group activities that provide opportunities to build relationships with other Visions students and families.

In order to meet college requirements, a high school student in the K-12 Home School Academy may enroll in community college classes, with approval from a Visions counselor.



9-12 INDEPENDENT STUDY ACADEMY

The Visions In Education 9-12 Independent Study Academy (9-12 Academy) is open to students in grades 9-12 and is a non-classroom, standards-based independent study program.

Students in the 9-12 Academy receive academic support from credentialed teachers. Parents agree to help the student succeed by maintaining ongoing communication, providing necessary transportation, and monitoring educational progress.



Curriculum is matched to a student's skill level, and instructional materials are provided. Students may also be provided a personal computer for curriculum support and for communication between the student and teacher.

The 9-12 Academy places special emphasis on mastering knowledge and skills necessary to pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) and to complete graduation requirements.

Upon graduation from the 9-12 Academy, a student will be prepared to enter the workforce, transition to a career technical school, or enroll in community college with the potential to transfer to a four-year college.
