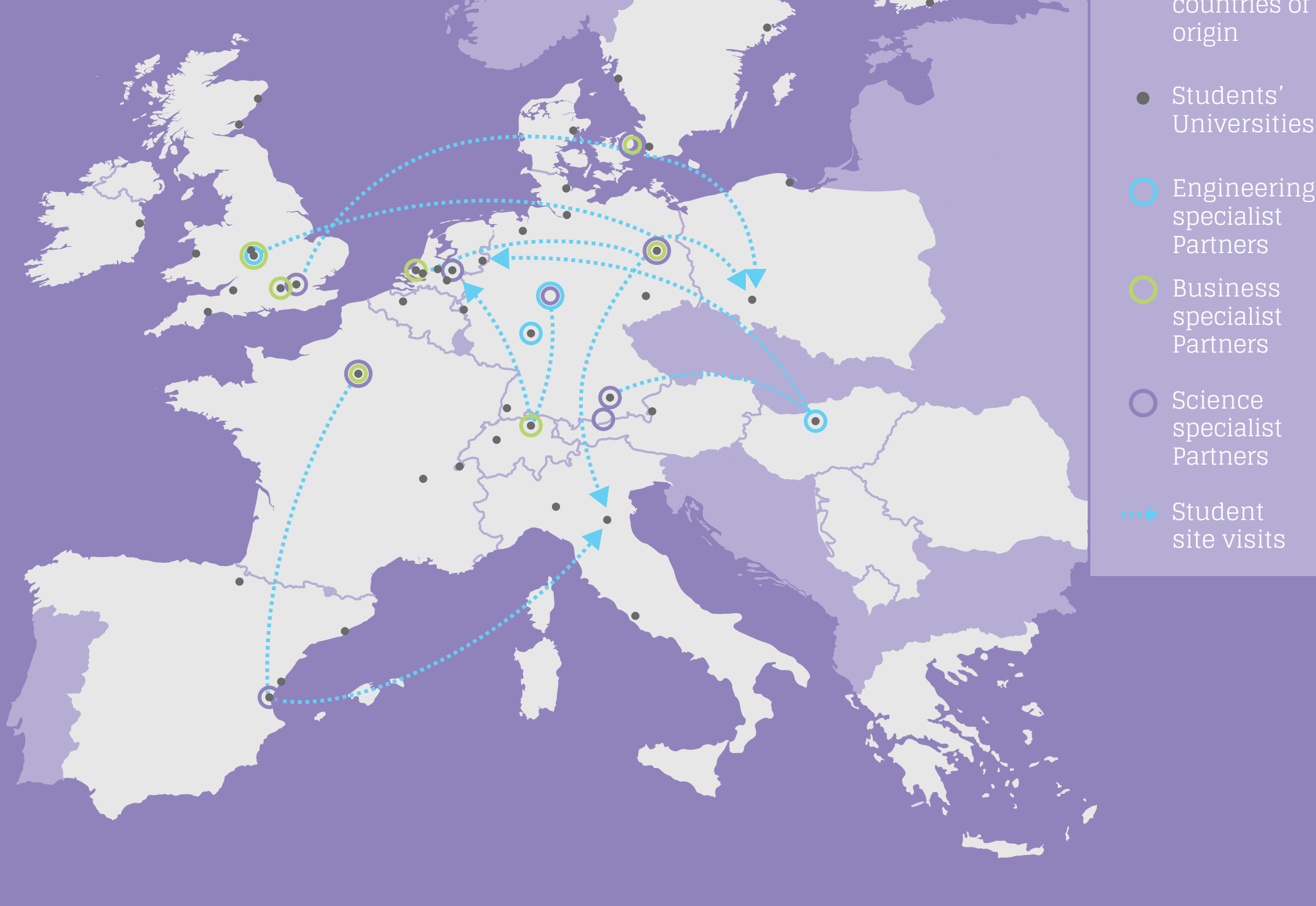


The Climate-KIC summer school: creating Europe's climate change innovators of the future

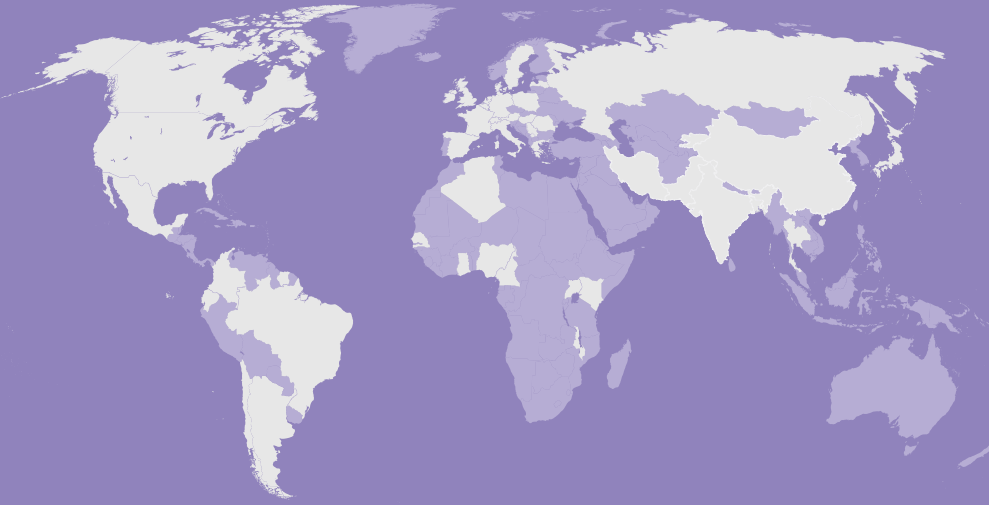
Europe's biggest climate change summer school brings together nearly 300 students from across Europe to create future climate entrepreneurs.

The summer school journeys

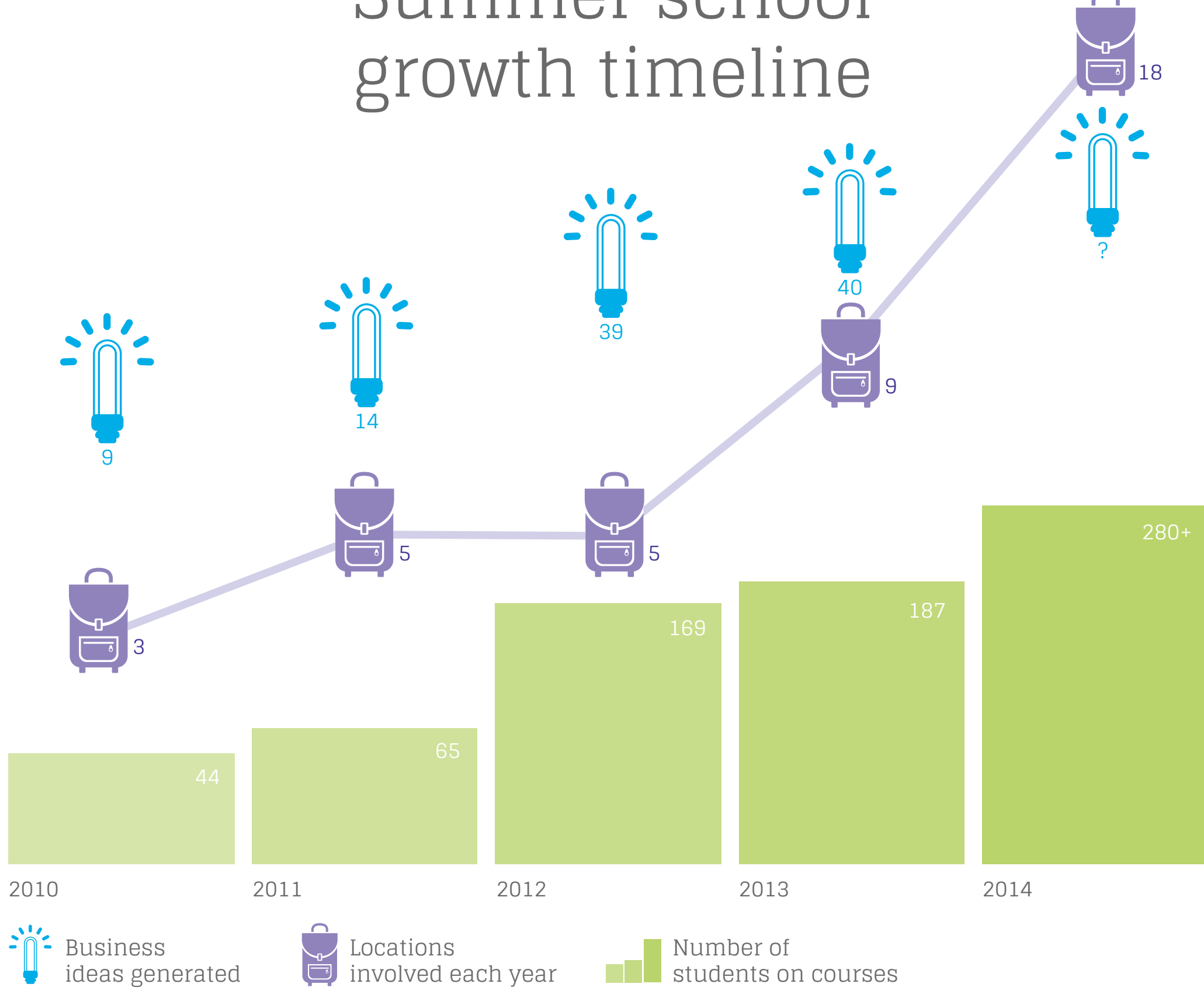

Snapshot of student specialisms

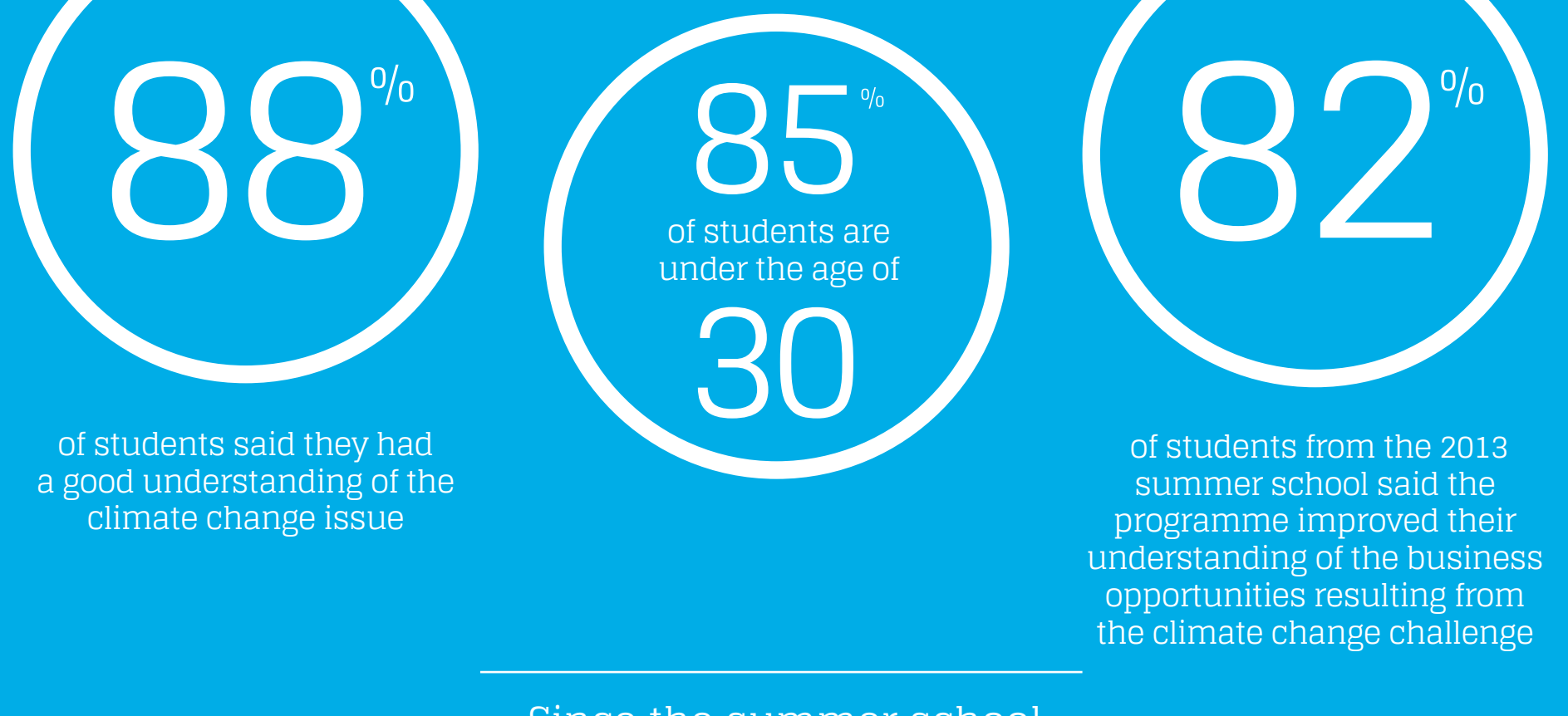

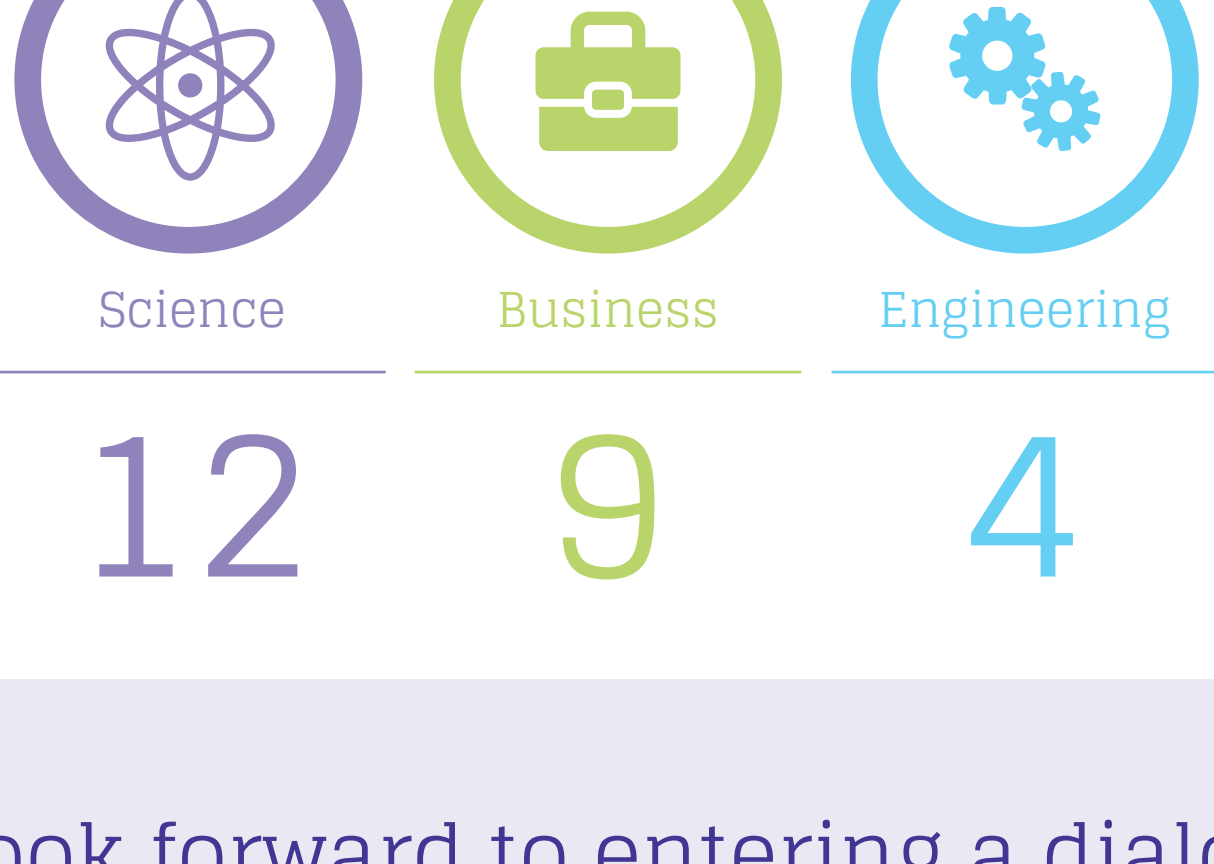


Since the summer school started in 2010...
