From the UK: *Contractions*. An ink-black comedy about the boundaries between work and play: Emma's been seeing Darren. She thinks she's in love. Her manager thinks she's in breach of contract. The situation needs to be resolved. Is there humanity in Human Resources? Mike Barlett's debut, *My Child* (Royal Court, May 2007) saw him hailed by The *Stage* as 'one of the most exciting new talents to emerge in recent times'. He has worked with various theatres since graduating, including Paines Plough, the Royal Court, Soho and Hampstead. *Contractions* was first presented at The Royal Court Theatre, London in May 2008.

The Common Wealth Endeavors double-bill will run at Common Ground Theatre in Durham, Thursdays through Saturdays at 8 p.m., February 19 - March 7, 2015, with matinees at 3 p.m. on February 22 and March 1. The performance on February 19 is a pay-what-you-can preview, with a cash-only \$5 minimum.
