Barbara Goldberg, raised in Forest Hills, New York, is the author of 5 prize-winning books of poetry, including *The Royal Baker's Daughter*, recipient of the Felix Pollak Poetry Prize. Her poems and translations have appeared in the *American Poetry Review*, *Gettysburg Review*, *Poetry* and *The Paris Review* as well as in *The Best American Poetry*. Among her awards are two fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts; numerous grants from the Maryland State Arts Council; the Armand G. Erpf Award from the Translation Center, Columbia University; as well as national awards in fiction, feature writing and speechwriting. A former senior speechwriter for AARP, she currently is Senior Editor, International Editions of the Word Works.

Books co-translated and edited with Moshe Dor include *Scorched by the Sun: Poems by Moshe Dor* and *The Fire Stays in Red: Poems by Ronny Somck*. In addition they collaborated on numerous anthologies of contemporary Israeli poetry including *After the First Rain: Israeli Poems on War and Peace* (foreword by Prime Minister Shimon Peres) and *The Stones Remember: Native Israeli Poetry*, which received the Witter Bynner Foundation Award.
