DECEMBER 9, 2024 - MONDAY - 7:30 PM

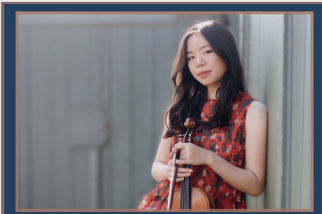
