








# All Years Chart - Historical Comparison (2012-2023)



#### Severity


Severe+ dog bite injuries (the least frequent) rose 193% between 2018 and 2023. Moderate dog bite injuries (the next least frequent) rose 49% during the same period. The trendline shows that moderate bites have been rising since 2012 (34%) but not as fast as severe+ bite injuries (187%).



#### Age Groups

Severe+ dog bite injuries rose for all age groups between 2018 and 2023, 1-9 years (275%) and 10-39 years (117%) but rose the most for ≥ 40 years (433%). The rise within the ≥ 40 age group started before the Covid pandemic.

In 2022, there was an unreported fatal dog mauling in Austin of a 41-year old man experiencing homelessness involving 6 unrestrained pit bulls.



# Fastest Rising Age Group

# 40-49 yrs

Among the  $\geq$  40 year old age group, 40-49 years rose the most over the 12-year period, nearly doubling in the number of incidents between the two 6-year periods (2012-2017 and 2018-2023) from 39 to 77, a 97% rise. Followed by  $\geq$  70 years, which also saw nearly a doubling between the two periods from 12 to 22, an 83% rise.





From 2014 to 2023, total bites by pit bulls increased 81%.

From 2018 to 2023, severe+ bites by pit bulls increased 533%.



## **SEVERE+ Dog Bite Injury**

Pit bulls inflicted 42% of all severe and life-threatening injuries ("severe+"), over 4 times more than the next closest breed.



## **MODERATE Dog Bite Injury**

Pit bulls inflicted 27% of all moderate injuries, over 2 times more than the next closest breed.




From 2012 to 2017, pit bulls were involved in 37% of multi-dog bites (37/101). From 2018 to 2023, that rose to 70% (85/121).






## San Antonio Animal Care Services, Texas

#### Severity


Severe dog bite injuries (the least frequent) were stable within a rising human population, then rose 169% from 2018 to 2023. "Moderate" dog bite injuries (the next least frequent) rose 18% during the same period. The trendline shows that moderate bite injuries have been declining since 2012.



#### Age Groups

Severe dog bite injuries for all age groups began rising in 2018, but rose the most for 10-39 years (138%) and ≥ 40 years (396%) between 2018 to 2023. The ≥ 40 year age group was stable until the first year of the pandemic.

In 2023, there were 5 highprofile dog maulings in the city covered by the media, including 2 fatal dog attacks. Of these victims, 80% (4 of 5) were ≥ 40 years old.†



## Fastest Rising Age Group

#### ≤ 70 vrs

Among the  $\geq$  40 years age group,  $\geq$  70 years rose the most over the 12-year period, more than doubling in the number of incidents between the two 6-year periods (2012-2017 and 2018-2023) from 29 to 71, a 145% rise. Followed by 60-69 years, which also more than doubled between the two periods from 30 to 61, a 103% rise.



Of the 411 dog bites that resulted in hospitalization (409) or death (2) in 2023 so far, 331 had a recorded breed in the ACS database. Of them, 101 were designated American Staffordshire Terriers, commonly known as pit bulls. This is over 4 times more than any other dog breed.
